Students in Prep are required to wear their sports uniform every day of the week.

Year 1 to 6 Uniform



Students in Year 1 to Year 6 are required to wear their formal uniform three days a week.



Formal uniform pieces cannot be mixed with sport uniform

*Formal Uniform Shoes: Black leather school shoe, no mesh, no patent leather, no additional colours. No sandshoes/joggers

Year 1 to 6 Uniform



Students in Year 1 to Year 6 are required to wear their sport uniform two days a week.

Prep to Year 6 accessories



Accessories

- All hair accessories are to be navy, white or maroon.
- No makeup
- Clear lip balm
- No nail polish or fake/acrylic nails

<u>Hairstyles</u>

- Hair should be kept neat and tidy.
- An unacceptable hairstyle is one that draws attention to the person or causes distraction:
 - Close-shaved heads (less than a two-blade length, except for medical reasons, are not permitted)
 - Shaved lines or patterns are unacceptable.
 - Hairstyles which have some of the head shaved and other sections long, are unacceptable.
 - Hair that falls below the shoulders must be tied back using ribbon, hair elastics or scrunchies in school colours.
 - Fringes that obscure vision or fall over the eyes must be pinned back.
 - Radical hairstyles or colours are not acceptable.

<u>Jewellery</u>

- Single plain gold or silver sleepers or studs (one only in both ears)
- Watch
- For Smart Watches connected to phone/internet/cellular network- same rules apply as for mobile phone - will need to be put in classroom lock box during school hours)
- A religious medal or cross may be worn on a plain chain
- No rings or bracelets
